


FLAGS OF THE NATIONAL YACHT CLUB

Burgee



37.1 Burgee: triangular, blue and white quartered, red St George's Cross, blue to hoist.

The Club burgee should only be flown from the masthead.


Club Ensian



37.2 Club Ensign: The Club ensign shall be the field azure, in the first quarter the national tricolour of green, white and orange; in the centre of the fourth quarter a four stringed harp argent, and shall be subject to regulations imposed upon the Club by the Department of the Marine.


The ensign may only be worn aboard a vessel owned by the holder of a warrant which must be obtained from the Club, such a warrant must be on board the vessel when the ensign is worn. The National Ensign must be flown from the stern of a vessel or from the masthead of the mizen mast. The National Yacht Club is privileged to be the only Club with permission to include the State Harp in its ensign.

Commodore




37.3 Commodore: Club burgee in the form of a broad pennant with swallow tail.

Vice Commodore




37.4 Vice-Commodore: Club burgee in the form of a broad pennant with swallow tail with the addition of a white ball in the blue quarter to the hoist.


Rear Commodore



37.5 Rear Commodore: Club burgee in the form of a broad pennant swallow tail with the addition of two white balls in the blue quarter to the hoist.








37.6 Past Commodore, 37.6 Past Vice-Commodore and 37.6 Past Rear Commodore shall be identical to the flag of the respective officers, but with a vertical stripe, argent, upon the hoist.

House Flag



The House Flag shall be rectangular and of the same colour and design as the Burgee, but with a shallow or obtuse swallow tailed.

The House Flag shall be flown by a member's yacht from the starboard spreader where the mast head is not available for a club burgee. When visiting another country and flying the house flag, the courtesy flag must be flown from the superior higher position with the house flag immediately underneath. Other flags should be flown under the house flag.

Trans-Atlantic Pennant



The Trans-Atlantic Pennant shall be the same colour and design as the burgee, but shall be some 60" long and 8" wide at the hoist.

This pennant shall be awarded by the Flag Officers of the Club to a Full Member who has completed a Trans-Atlantic crossing.

Members are requested to adhere to the correct protocol with flying the Club flags.
